

Flexibility facing exceptional circumstances (art 20)



- Unusual event outside control of MS leading to severe economic downturn
- Unfavourable consequences in MS public finance
- EC may for a period of <u>max 18 months</u>:
 - Provided it is necessary to respond to event
 - Increase 10% co-financing in interim payments
 - Select operations already completed/fully implemented
 - Expenditure eligible for operations to respond to such circumstance
 - Extend submission of data to EC by 3 months

Data collection UBO Beneficial owners (Annex XVII)

- Information on UBO-owners of the beneficiary (AMLD-Directive)
 - first name and last name, date of birth and VAT or TIN-number
- Information whether the beneficiary or other entities implementing the operation in accordance with Union PP rules use contractors and if so, once the corresponding contracts are signed, information on:
 - (a) all contractors, incl name and VAT registration/TIN of the contractor(s)
 - (b) and UBO of the contractor, namely first name and last names, dates of birth and VAT registration/TIN number
 - (c) contracts (date of the contract, name, reference and contract amount)

Art 8 ESF+: Respecting the FR Charter

ESF+ operations
shall be selected and
implemented while

In accordance with Article 69(7) CPR, MS shall ensure the effective examination of complaints. This is without prejudice to the general possibility of citizens and stakeholders to address complaints to the EC, including with regard to infringements of the Charter



Where EC finds that there has been an infringement of the Charter, EC shall take into account the gravity of the infringement in its determination of the corrective measures to be applied in line with CPR

Financial rules for synergies

- No profit rule for grants
- No substitution rule
 - if an ESIF project requires 15% of national co-financing, it cannot be contributed from HE, or if a HE Innovation project requires 30% of national funding, it cannot be sourced from the ESIF
- No double funding (DF)
 - same expenditure/cost item cannot receive support from multiple instruments (ESIF, HE or other).
 - Cost/expenditure item is limited to the resources actually used for the action/project, meaning that e.g. only the depreciation part or personnel costs allocated to ESIF action/project would be subject to the prohibition of DF
- Cross-financing
 - Joint support ERDF/ESF+ limited to 15% (art 25 CPR)

Views from ECA

Risk of fraud

Key point:

REACT-EU, by providing significant additional funding in a short period of time, carries a higher risk of irregularity and fraud, which needs to be addressed by all stakeholders.

Flexibility in budgeting

Key point:

The proposal does not justify why lowering the threshold for operations that can be phased between different programme periods from EUR 10 million to EUR 5 million is not restricted to the temporary measures.

Programming and monitoring

Key points:

- The proposal does not include provisions on mitigating the risk of deadweight from retrospective approval for projects.
- The proposal introduces improved provisions for tracking of the funding provided to address emergency situations.

Cohesion Action for Refugees in Europe (CARE)




- Amending CPR and FEAD 2014-2020
- Supported by either ERDF or ESF (Reporting rules simplified)
- Retroactive eligibility to 24.2.2022 (shelter, reception centers)
- Extends by 1 year 100% EU financing (1.7.2021-30.6.2022)
 - Request of 100% does not need EC approving modification of OP
- Using up to 9.5 Bn EUR of 2022 REACT and unused 2014-2020 CPR funds
- Increase REACT 2021 pre-financing to 15% to all MS and to 45% for MS where inflow refugees above 1% (HU, PL, RO, SK, AT, BU, CZ, EE, LT) and unit cost 40 EUR/refugee (basic needs food/shelter) for 13 weeks
- Above measures should release 17 Bn EUR

FAST CARE(Flexibility Assistance to Territories)



- Emergency and LT integration
- Not only refugee but third country nationals
- Support also by CF (not only ERDF/CF)
- Supporting completed projects
- Unit cost 100 EUR/pp for 26 weeks
- Support if person moves outside OP area but within MS
- 100% co-financing extended to end 2023 (ring-fencing 30% of operations to NGO/LRA)
- Modification CPR 2021/1060 100% extended until mid-2024
- Above measures supported by REACT EU 35 Bn EUR
