







 - Interreg and Interact programme evaluations and programming support










- <u>Cross border</u> Interreg A cooperation between regions from two or more Member States. Regions on the borders or adjacent to them
- <u>Transnational</u> Interreg B regions from several countries. Promote better cooperation and regional development
- Interregional Interreg C pan-European level, builds networks to develop good practice and facilitate the exchange



Managing complexity...

- **Programming/Planning:** Robust starting point/foundation, e.g. rationale, area analysis
- Technical harmonisation and simplification: important steps taken (but can get lost in the addition of new requirements...)
- Sharing knowledge and expertise: Interact, development of joint/shared systems
- Trust and capacity building: complexity can come from lack of understanding and resource
- Clear, timely regulations and guidance: Clear understanding, simple texts that are agreed in time
- 'Make peace' with some level of complexity
