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# What is the **UCPM**?

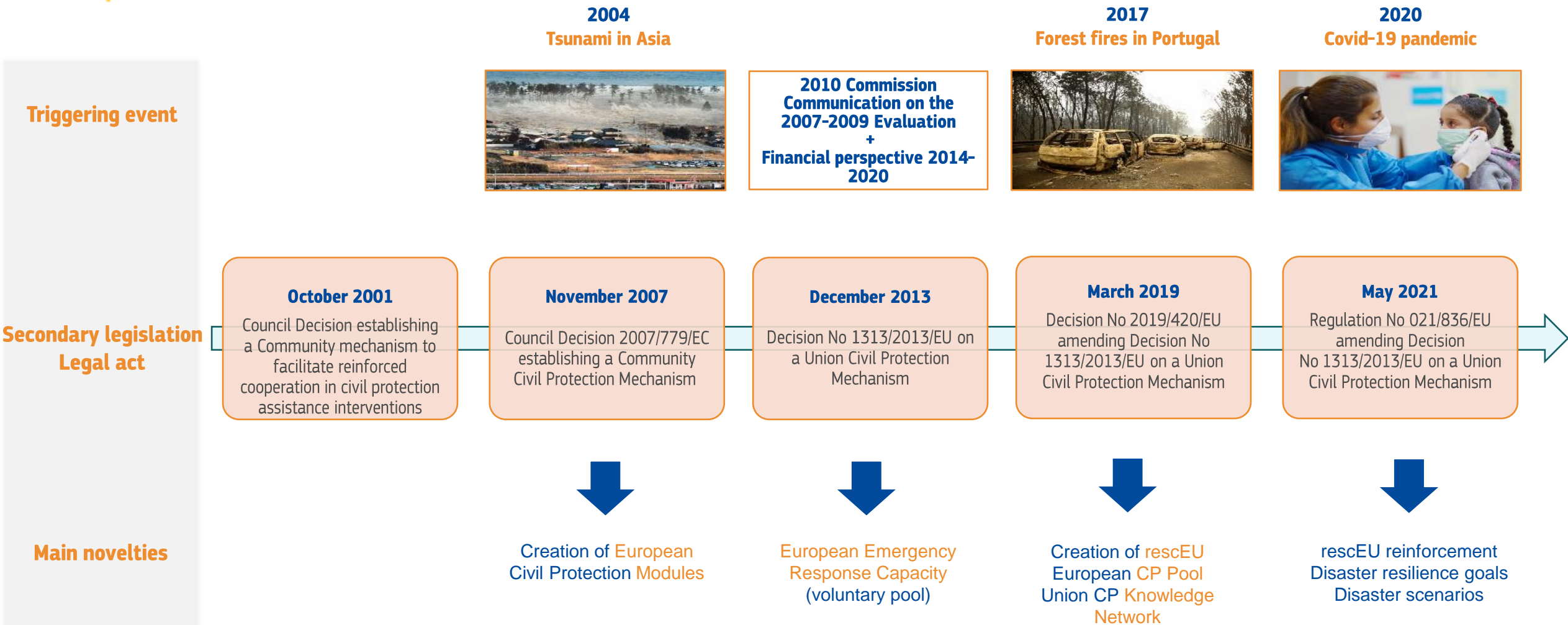


The UCPM, established in 2001, aims to  
**strengthen cooperation**  
in the area of **civil protection**  
within **the EU + 7 participating States**



to **improve prevention, preparedness, and response** to natural and man-made disasters.

## The issues...

- **Large-scale:** all Member States impacted simultaneously
- **Cross-sectoral impact:** from health sector to internal market
- **Market competition** for procurement of needed items



## Covid-19 pandemic

an unprecedented dimension

## ...the UCPM response

1. Swiftly established the first EU reserve of medical countermeasures & PPE
2. Facilitated and funded +100,000 citizens' repatriations
3. Facilitated the exchange of medical teams & equipment between Member States
4. Offered +46 million doses of vaccines

However, despite quick operational response, the UCPM response system, in the first weeks and months of the crisis, was:

- not fast enough
- not flexible enough

## The issues...

- **Forest fires** trend has been **increasing** at an **alarming rate** in Europe in the past years.  
Forest fire seasons:
  - **start earlier**
  - **last longer**
  - **hit new Member States**
- **Climate change** is an **accelerator** → fire danger to increase in future
- **Market rigidity**: scarce availability of assets, long time for procurement

## Forest fires An alarming trend



## ...the UCPM response

**This year** season broke all **(negative) records!**

+250% over the average yearly burnt area (since 2006), 3 times the size of Luxembourg!

The UCPM has been activated 10 times, often simultaneously.

31 firefighting planes, 8 helicopters, 6 ground modules deployed (since June).

However, some requests were only partially answered, or not at all.



**Europe reached its limit in relevant firefighting capacity.**



## The challenges...

- **Large-scale,**
- **long-lasting,**
- **Complex** emergency
- Involving **multiple sectors** – some beyond the ‘traditional’ civil protection competence (i.e. agricultural, energy, cultural heritage) and **several, different actors** at internat., EU, and national level
- First ever **private sector contribution** under the UCPM
- Third countries’ interest

The largest UCPM operation ever

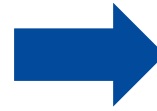
## ...the UCPM response

- **Largest UCPM response operation**
- **93 requests for assistance** since February 2022
- **+ 66,000 tonnes of in-kind assistance** (Member States + rescEU)
- **All 27 Member + 3 Participating States** provided assistance
- **Over 1100 medical evacuations** to 19 countries
- Assistance provided also to Moldova, Slovakia, Poland, Czech Republic
- First activation of the **European Humanitarian Response Capacity**



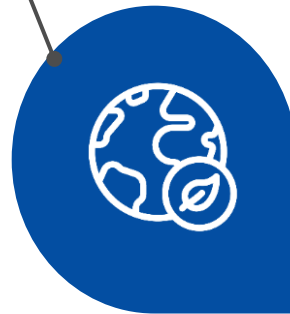

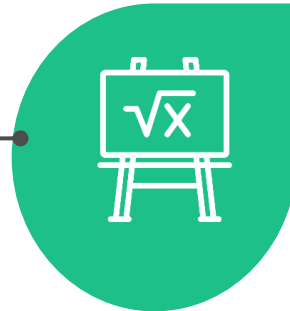
