TITLE II COMMON COMMERCIAL POLICY

> Article 206 (ex Article 131 TEC)


By establishing a customs union in accordance with Articles 28 to 32, the Union shall contribute, in the common interest, to the harmonious development of world trade, the progressive abolition of restrictions on international trade and on foreign direct investment, and the lowering of customs and other barriers.



The common commercial policy shall be based on uniform principles, particularly with regard to changes in tariff rates, the conclusion of tariff and trade agreements relating to trade in goods and services, and the commercial aspects of intellectual property, foreign direct investment, the achievement of uniformity in measures of liberalisation, export policy and measures to protect trade such as those to be taken in the event of dumping or subsidies. The common commercial policy shall be conducted in the context of the principles and objectives of the Union's external





TBTs, NTMs, 'behind-the border issues'

- Governments rely on Non-Tariff Measures to achieve public policy goals, including the protection of human health and the environment
- Regulators and law-makers translate collective preferences into binding rules

1. The Parties may engage in regulatory cooperation activities on a voluntary basis, without prejudice to the autonomy of their own decision-making and their respective legal orders. A Party may refuse to engage in or it may withdraw from regulatory cooperation activities. A Party that refuses to engage in or that withdraws from regulatory cooperation activities should explain the reasons for its decision to the other Party.

Article 114

Regulatory approximation



- 1. The Parties recognise the importance of the approximation of sexisting legislation to that of the European Union—shall ensure that its existing laws and future legislation will be gradually made compatible with the EU acquis.
- 2. Such approximation will start on the date of signing of this Agreement, and will gradually extend to all the elements of the EU α acquis referred to in Annex XVII to this Agreement.
